Her excitement for the role stems from the strong community bonds and the city's potential for growth. She is particularly eager to enhance parks and recreational opportunities, building on the Master Park Plan adopted in 2021, which includes community-driven program recommendations and facility improvements. The goal is to expand park facility offerings and to build upon a legacy of well-maintained, accessible parks and recreational facilities that enrich community life, promoting physical fitness, mental well-being, and community engagement.

She feels that success will be measured by program participation rates, community feedback, park usage, budget management, revenue generation, and positive media relations that highlight the department's impact.

Looking ahead, the new Parks and Rec Director plans to expand community events and programs while strengthening partnerships with local organizations. Ensuring inclusivity and accessibility in all offerings involves staff training, developing targeted outreach strategies, and regular community feedback.
